

Welded vs. Sewn

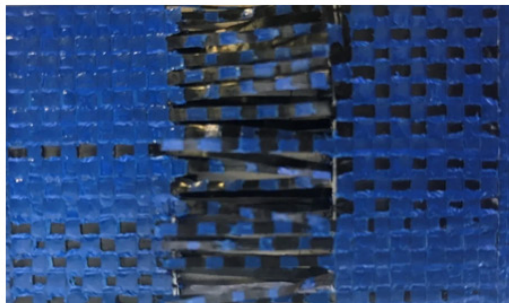
WELDED

- Fully welded pool cover panels are edge-to-edge seamed together and welded from top and bottom.
- There are **ZERO holes** in an Alta fully welded pool cover.
- This eliminates stitching and thus the #1 failure point of pool covers on the market today.
- Fully welded seams have a clean look with **adding 3x the strength.**



SEWN

- Sewn pool covers have overlapping seams that are stitched together, weakening the base material.
- **Each stitched hole is a point of entry for water,** which is why sewn pool covers can easily double their weight through absorption.
- The **first point of failure will likely be the stitched seaming** as this will quickly deteriorate from UV exposure.
